

THE ANATOMY OF A long-term confinement area



- A long-term confinement area (below) makes it impossible for your pup to get it wrong. This is critical because every time he gets it wrong, he's developing the wrong habit.
- In this set-up, he is very likely to potty in the correct place, spend time in his crate, and chew the appropriate items.
- Unless you can give him 100% of your attention, this is where he'll need to hang out.
- Using a potty pad made of artificial turf makes the transition to grass much easier.
- Hide lots of yummy treats in the crate often so it seems, to your puppy, that the crate is the place to be.
- Make sure that the confinement area is full of various chew toys, so the right choice is easy to make.
